Mr Leggett attended and spoke whilst the keynote address was delivered by the Secretary–Treasurer of the Ex POW Association, Captain Ray Galliot, RFD. Mr Michael Sutherland, MLA Member for Mount Lawley and Cr Rod Willox, AM, RFD, ED, JP also attended. The school community was able to acknowledge Mr Sutherland's election as speaker of the Legislative Assembly. Congratulations to him.

The decorum of the students at the ceremony was first rate. They behaved impeccably and were a credit to families. The Senior Concert Band played superbly and Christian La Piana played the very demanding Last Post and Reveille like a veteran musician. The music students add much to these ceremonies and the many hours of rehearsing certainly showed. Well done.

This week marks the NAPLAN testing regime in Year 9 with students completing tests in Mathematics, Reading and Writing. These results will be made available later in the year.

Next week sees Years 10-12 commence their Semester 1 examinations. On the days when they have examinations students should ensure that they are on time and have all required equipment. They must also wear full school uniform. Year 10 students have examinations on several days during this period. Where an examination is not scheduled Year 10 students will be completing their usual timetable. The Year 10 students complete examinations as part of their preparation for upper-school studies.

The next P&C meeting is scheduled for Monday, 27 May 2013. Parents should note the new start time of 7:00pm. The meeting will consider a number of submissions for funding and parents are urged to attend. It is a way of engaging in the education program of your children. ROAD SAFETY

Road safety for students remains a concern for school staff. Again, I am seeking the co-operation of parents, especially during the busy start and end of the school day.

To improve traffic flow on Woodsome Street parents of Mount Lawley PS have been reminded that the car park on Hamer Park is to be used to drop children off and not Woodsome Street.

Additionally, the City of Stirling has made some modifications to the Middle School kiss-and-drop to only allow a left hand exit. This was a solution to ease congestion. Parents should exit the kiss-and-drop and drive down Woodsome Street to the Stancliffe Street round-a-bout and then proceed. Some are seeking to enter the car park of the bowling club and then reversing back into Woodsome Street, which is creating a dangerous situation. Please assist by driving safely – in the end it will be quicker.



Parking on the verge of Woodsome Street next to Hamer Park also contravenes the City of Stirling parking by-laws and should be discontinued. The City of Stirling has been requested to assist with managing Woodsome Street.

I would also repeat the request that the main staff car park should not be used as a drop-off and pick-up point during these busy times. Students, including primary school ones, can walk in this area at these times and parent assistance is requested to ensure there are no accidents.

I would ask for your support to assist road safety around the school.
