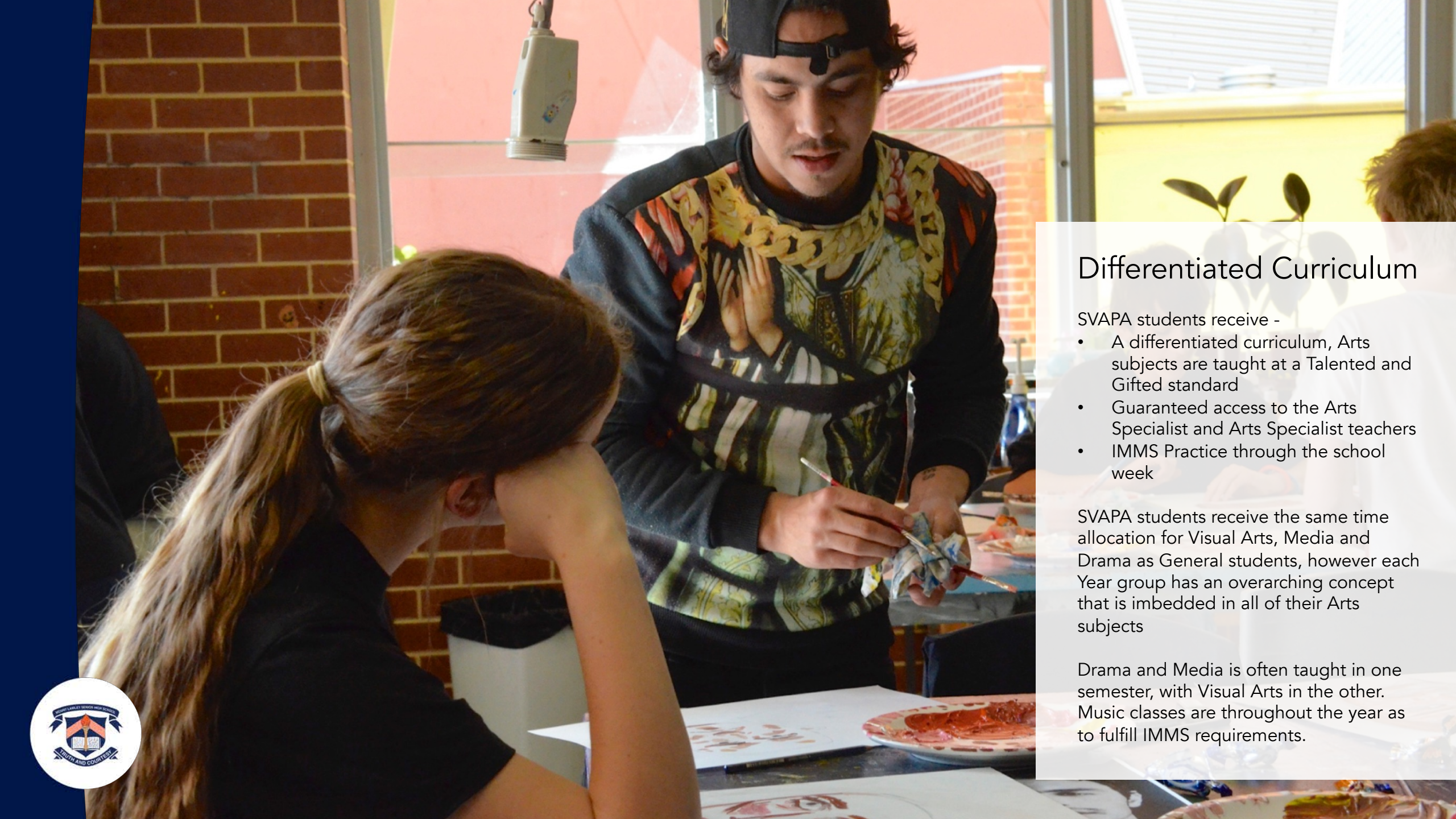


The Specialist Visual and Performing Arts program has been running at Mount Lawley Senior High School for 20 years.

We are a school-based, industry focused program where students from Year 7 - 9 receive an enriched and diverse arts education through **extra-curricular** and **differentiated** curriculum

We are the only **cross-arts** program in the WA, incorporating Drama, Media, Visual Arts, Music and Movement. The program is open to 32 merit selected students, with selection taking place in Year 6.





## Differentiated Curriculum

SVAPA students receive -

- A differentiated curriculum, Arts subjects are taught at a Talented and Gifted standard
- Guaranteed access to the Arts Specialist and Arts Specialist teachers
- IMMS Practice through the school week

SVAPA students receive the same time allocation for Visual Arts, Media and Drama as General students, however each Year group has an overarching concept that is imbedded in all of their Arts subjects

Drama and Media is often taught in one semester, with Visual Arts in the other. Music classes are throughout the year as to fulfill IMMS requirements.







## Year 8 The Ensemble Year

Working in ensembles and learning through collaboration, to establish the generosity and reliability needed to excel in the Arts.



## Year 9 The Experimental Year

Students explore Contemporary and Immersive Theatre, Live Art, Sound Installation, Video, Robotics, Conceptual and Environmental Art, and Electronic Art to expand their understanding of the possibilities the Arts can offer.



## Enrichment and Extension

SVAPA student are required to commit to multiple extra-curricular activities through the term.

## School Experience

Mount Lawley Senior High School has a wonderful Middle Schooling ethos and SVAPA students will be a part of that Middle Schooling experience for the first two years.

Through Year 7 and 8, SVAPA students will be a form class together and assigned an community, as well as attend all their MESH (Math, English, Science and HASS) and Arts classes together.

They will have a chance to meet other students in their communities during Design and Technologies, Home Economics, Language and Physical Education.

When students enter Year 9, they transition to Upper School. Students still attended all Arts classes together, however streaming of MESH classes will be introduced

## Student Expectations

A continuous commitment and engagement in the Arts is necessary for students to succeed and progress.

It is expected that the Arts program activities take priority over external activities.

To monitor each student's development, the SVAPA Coordinator, Arts Program Coordinator and an Associate Principal meet once per semester to review their reports.

Students need to remain committed, and display positive behaviour, along with overall academic progress to remain in the program.

Out of area students who leave the program will need to enrol in their local intake area school.

## SVAPA Funding and Support

The cost of the program is \$220 per year.

Our main source of funding comes from fundraising from the Lawley Art Auction – a very large and well respected event in June.

Teachers work on a volunteer basis in all extra-curricular activities.

We rely on parent support through the P&C sub-committees, the Lawley Art auction, SVAPA parents and Music parents committee. We ask all SVAPA parents to be active in their child's arts education.

SVAPA Coordinator, Teacher in Charge of Music and Arts Program Coordinator, Arts Teachers work together to create multiple opportunities for your children.
