The students enjoyed a homestay with families from our sister school in Hangzhou, Hangzhou Number 14 High School. They also toured the magnificent West Lake. The final day was spent in the new sister school of Mount Lawley Senior High School, Houzhai Middle School in the city of Yiwu in Zhejiang Province. Zhejiang is the sister state of Western Australia.

Attendance is a theme addressed in the Update. I remain concerned at the rate, which is below that expected for this school's band. In Term 3, the rate declined to below 90%, which is considered a benchmark for achievement. Whilst it is acknowledged that August was particularly bad for the flu, with warmer weather the rate of attendance should improve. Parents are asked to assist through encouraging attendance. When students are absent, there is a legal requirement to provide an explanation. This may be through a note, SMS, telephone call or email. Again parent support is requested.

NAPLAN results have been provided and analysis of the results is underway. It is pleasing to see the mean scores of the school exceeding both those for the nation and the state in all components. The NAPLAN scores for 2012 are tabulated below:


