The School Ball was held a fortnight ago and the students attending enjoyed the occasion tremendously. They looked very impressive in their attire and participated actively in the dancing and networking.

As the school grows in size it is becoming increasingly difficult to locate a venue that will accommodate the number of students in Year 12 and their outside partners. It is highly likely in 2015 (when current Year 10 are Year 12) the school will not be able to sustain outside partners. Other factors that impact on this decision is the age of outside partners (many between 18-21) and their behaviour. Even at the recent ball, several outside partners, young adult men, were not particularly co-operative with staff concerning the behaviour requirements such as no smoking. The ball runs because of the assistance of staff and it is not reasonable having them deal with unco-operative young adults who are not students of the school.



The rollout of notebook computers to Year 10 students is being finalised. To provide the students with a notebook has meant the school purchasing additional machines to add to the fleet. This cannot be done next year due to the possibility of having to replace a number of age expired machines on loan to current Year 12 students.

School staff are exploring other approaches to retain the 1:1 model. One approach is to assist parents purchase the computer over a number of years. Students bringing their own device is also being assessed, however, there are some challenges that need to be solved. Not issuing a computer and keeping them at school is also an option. As this work continues, parents of Middle School students will be advised.

Parents will be aware that in 2016 changes to the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) will be introduced. These are being developed in detail and will have an impact on Year 9 students when they select upper-school courses next year. This will be the first group that the new WACE will affect.

In order for students to gain the WACE key factors must be achieved. This information is taken from the website of the School Curriculum and Standards Authority (SCSA).

Breadth and depth

Complete a minimum of 20 course units or the equivalent. This requirement must include at least:

- Four different course units from English, Literature and/or English as an Additional Language or Dialect, studied during Year 11 and Year 12 (at least two of these units must be completed in Year 12).
- One pair of course units from each of List A (arts/languages/social sciences) and List B (mathematics/science/technology) completed in Year 12.

Achievement standard

Achieve a 'C' grade average or better across the best 16 course units of which at least eight must be completed in Year 12.

Preliminary Stage units, endorsed programs and/or VET credit transfer can reduce the required number of course units by up to six units.

• English language competence

Achieve a 'C' grade or better in any Stage 1 or higher course unit from English, Literature and/or English as an Additional Language or Dialect (except 1A and 1B for English as an Additional Language or dialect).

(At Mount Lawley SHS students study subjects over a calendar year, so two course units equals a subject.)

This information is published to assist parents understand the requirements and assist students work to achieve them. It remains a goal of the school to have all students gain the WACE.
