LAWLEY UPDATE Term 1 2013 No. 6, 2013

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This Update is the final one for Term 1, 2013. Shortly, the newsletter will also be provided and these two publications symbolise the end of the term. Reflecting over the last 11 weeks, time has certainly passed quickly.

In the short time since Easter, much has happened in terms of preparing for 2015. The proposed building has been planned and final decisions such as the make-up of the outside facia are now being made. It is hoped that the public art work that is required for public buildings can be incorporated into the finish of the outside and so contribute to its place on the grounds.

Planning for the intake of Year 7 and Year 8 in 2015 is also being undertaken. While much is made of the Year 7 transition to high school, staff are very mindful of the usual transition requirements for Year 8. We expect that over 500 new students will commence at Mount Lawley Senior High School in 2015.

To assist parents understand the issues and to track developments, there is some information on the Department of Education's website as well as this school's. It is our intent that Year 7 and Year 8 students will function in the Middle School as Years 8/9 do at the moment. They will spend most of their time in their communities and enjoy a small team of teachers. Year 9 students will be housed in the new building and have a slightly different timetable from at the moment in that they will have more choice in subject selections. This will assist in easing their transition to Senior School.

Thanks to the very generous support of the P&C, the school has been able to install speakers into the gymnasium. Trialled at last week's Middle School assembly, the sound system for school events is immeasurably improved. Video and music performances will also benefit with this installation. Phys Ed classes and Healthy Active participants will also be able to use the system.

The P&C assistance in funding the speakers is valued and really appreciated. The first full school assembly where the whole school will benefit is the ANZAC Observance on Friday, 19 April 2013. Parents are welcome to attend and join the students acknowledge the debt to those who have served our nation.

The challenges of social media misuse and bullying via electronic means feature regularly in the press. The school has a program, delivered primarily in the Middle School, where an anti-bullying approach is taken. This week saw the Australian Communications and Media Authority (ACMA) Cyber Smart training delivered to Years 8-10 students. This focused on how young people use mobile devices and why they need to be careful with whom they engage. The presentation looked at cyber bullying, identify theft and exposure to pornography and undesirable individuals. ACMA staff also presented to school staff and in the evening, to parents. Thanks to those parents who attended the parent seminar. There is a need for vigilance around the use of technology by young people.

Parents will also be aware that last week, the Prime Minister, the Hon Julia Gillard, MP was in China and she visited Chenjinglun High School, a school that Mount Lawley Senior High School has a relationship with through the Asian Education Foundation's (AEF) China Bridge initiative. Since 2011, students attending the two schools have, via video, conversed with each other. It was planned that the PM would join in the video link, however, this did not eventuate. The two groups of students conversed on Monday and Ms Gillard did, however, visit the Beijing Chenjinglun High School as planned on Tuesday. This program highlights the continuing engagement that the school has with Mandarin, Asia and language and cultural education initiatives. Thanks to the Years 11/12 Mandarin students who participated in the video link-up.

As per the note provided to Middle School students on Monday afternoon, there was an incident that led to school staff seeking police assistance to remove a student. Contrary to rumours, this was not due to drugs, violence or weapons but to ensure safety of students and a positive learning environment. School staff take the safety of students and the continuation of learning seriously and as with the Cyber Smart program referred to above, work across a range of domains to ensure this is delivered. The support from the police is appreciated to assist staff maintain a focus on learning.

As this is the last Update for the Term, I would like to wish all students, parents and staff all the best for the two week break. The first day back, Monday 6 May 2013 is a School Development Day with students resuming on Tuesday, 7 May 2013. With the onset of cooler weather, parents should ensure that students are attired in uniform items such as the wet weather jacket or pullover. Your support in this matter is appreciated.

PARENT AND STUDENT PATHWAY INFORMATION EVENING:


