I extend my apologies at the failure of the IT that meant the full effect of the staff presentations could not be enjoyed by parents. Individual appointments with a counsellor have been/will be made and parents can discuss their child's program. Again, I would urge parents to consider carefully the recommendations of staff. 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The University of Notre Dame Australia will be offering a July school holiday program for current Year 12 students. The course, Learning Skills will be offered in the week of July 8, with daily classes from 8.30am – 12.30pm.

**LEARNIING SKILLS** 

The University of Notre Dame Australia will be offering a **July school holiday** program for current Year 12 students.

The target group for this course is students who are likely to enter university through an alternative entry pathway, such as Notre Dame's bridging courses – the Tertiary Enabling Program (TEP) or Foundation Year (FY). We envisage that the course will be of particular interest to students completing Stage 1 courses.

The course will focus on skills of benefit to all students, including:

- Effective study techniques
- Organisational skills
- Use of study groups
- Reading and writing skills for university work.

The week would simulate the life of a university student, and the adult learning approach taken at university. Classes will be presented by experienced university staff, who teach first-year university students in a range of courses. Participants would pay \$175 for the course, which is well below the cost of similar courses offered elsewhere.

This is a Curriculum Council endorsed WACE course, with the program code CNDLS.

Students who successfully complete the course and maintain full attendance, achieving a final mark of at least 65% will be able to use this course to achieve 'advanced standing' (credit) at this University for EP001 Learning Skills. This is a required course in both the Tertiary Enabling Program (TEP) and Foundation Year (FY). There are significant personal, financial and course benefits to receiving advanced standing for a unit of study. Further, those students who complete this course, and meet the academic requirements will receive special consideration if applying to enter either TEP or FY. Students can choose to complete the course without undertaking the assessments, although this would preclude them from both using this as a WACE course, and would also preclude having the unit as potential 'advanced standing'.


