
Perth Festival Excursions


Marie mosaic

As inspiration for our mosaic here is another collaborative chemistry mosaic we found that appeared on the front cover of the 2011 September issue of *Nature Chemistry* (Volume 3, Issue 9). This cover was a celebration of the International Year of Chemistry and the 100th anniversary of the awarding of the Nobel Prize in Chemistry to Marie Curie. In this issue, Michelle Francl considers how the representation of women in science has changed since Curie's day. Michelle suggested the concept of having the Marie Mosaic created with images of female scientists. Fremantle Carpooling Success!




This Term


Arts Auction

Auditions


Expressions of interest are closed and annual auditions are coming up! For those with friends who are auditioning the dates are 30th and 31st of May.
