

AWESOME FESTIVAL

The AWESOME Festival is presented annually in the Perth CBD. It showcases an array of events including theatre, dance, music, film, literature, visual arts and creative hands-on activities. We take the **Year 7 SVAPA students** each year, usually to a program that consists of a workshop, a show, an exhibition and another activity.

This year we will be seeing *Tröll*, written and performed by Ralph McCubbin Howell, and directed by Charlotte Bradley and Hannah Smith. As mobile phones become light sources, laptops transform into skyscrapers, and charger cords morph into puppets, it tells a story both mythic and modern in the vein of *Stranger Things*.

Show description: It's 1998. Otto is twelve but online he's thirteen and he's pretty sure he gets away with it. He lives with his mum, dad, and sister, a mysterious Icelandic granny, and an ancient malevolent troll that's lurking in the walls. *Tröll* combines storytelling, projection, music and puppetry into an uncanny tale from the dial up age.



YEAR 9 CULTURAL CENTRE EXCURSION

The excursion is important part of the SVAPA curriculum. Students visit key art and creative institutions, to develop their understanding of the role they play in both the physical and professional landscape in Perth. It begins with a walk around the State Theatre Centre of Western Australia. We then continue on to explore the Blue Room, Boorla Baardip, Perth Institute of Contemporary Art (PICA) & Art Gallery of Western Australia (AGWA).

Students view and discuss artwork from a range of exhibitions. The first exhibition is top graduate High School student work at Pulse perspectives at AGWA. They see, discuss and reflect on the beautiful and diverse themes in the high caliber of works. We hope this experience will drive their ambition in seeking a place at Pulse one day.

Next, we enter PICA to see third year graduates work which is extremely innovative. There is hardly a painting to be seen! This is a world that is vast in its materials and exploration and our students see that art making is not limited to or defined by painting or drawing. In fact, Art schools push students to explore strange and unlikely materials in their processes. Video, sound, found object, installation and performance work are all presented. Wax sculptures, fishing tanks, old record players, and fluro lights have all found their way into an exhibition space.

The 9th June 2022 was a big day for the Year 9 SVAPA students. We were granted the opportunity to go on an all-day excursion to multiple arts venues in the Perth City area. We saw award-winning art from both high school and university students from Perth and around Australia at AGWA and PICA. We had lunch at Raine Square and then headed towards the Vincent Van Gogh exhibit where we could sit and watch, walk around, listen and learn as the interactive event unfolded.
